Malicious cyber actors could take advantage of public concern surrounding COVID-19, more commonly referred to as the Coronavirus, by conducting phishing attacks and disinformation campaigns. Phishing attacks often use a combination of email and bogus websites to trick victims into revealing sensitive information. Disinformation campaigns can spread discord, manipulate the public conversation, influence policy development, or disrupt markets.

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) encourages individuals to guard against COVID-19-related phishing attacks and disinformation campaigns by taking the following precautions.

COVID-19 CYBERSECURITY TIPS

- Avoid clicking on links in unsolicited emails/SMS Text messages and be wary of email attachments.
- **Do not** reveal personal or financial information to unknown sources, and do not respond to email/ SMS Text/ voice message solicitations for this information.
